Covid Updates

With the increasing numbers of Covid cases and the new Omicron variant we are continually monitoring the latest government guidance and making the necessary adjustments to play our part in keeping everyone safe.



To keep our staff, pupils, parents and visitors as safe as possible, the following measures are currently in place and we ask for your support with these;

- Staff will be asked to wear face coverings in communal places around the school.
- No Visitors are to come into school unless for Essential Visits i.e. Health Visitors and all visitors to our school will be asked to wear face coverings. Unfortunately, this means that we will not be able to invite Parents or Carers in for any performances, assemblies or sporting activities (to be reviewed at the end of January).
- Parents are asked to wear face coverings when dropping off in the mornings and picking up at the end of the day.

As a community we will do our best to support any families who find themselves struggling with guidance and the law.
