#### Summer Uniform and General Information:

As we are now in the summer term and the weather has finally improved, we would like to remind parents that children are now able to wear the summer uniform i.e. Summer Dresses or Shorts. Ties, Jumpers and Cardigans are standard items of all year uniform. Ties must still be worn by all children. If it is felt that it is too hot within the classrooms, staff give permission and encourage children to remove these. Cardigans and Jumpers do not need to be worn but must not be substituted for an alternative.



Please can all parents apply sun cream to their child before the start of the school day to help protect them whilst they are enjoying our outdoor facilities? Children may bring their own sun cream in so that they can reapply this if needed. Children should apply the sun cream themselves. Children will also require a hat and a water bottle daily. Water Bottles can be topped up safely with drinking water in their classrooms and are encouraged to drink this frequently.

#### **Pupil Absences:**

Please can we remind all parents/carers that all absences must be reported to the School Office or to Mrs Bracegirdle or Mrs Waring if you are informing us whilst bringing siblings to school.

If your child is absent you must contact school on the first day of absence and then everyday thereafter, providing the full reason as to why your child is unable to attend. Any absences such as holiday's, day trips and visiting family/friends, parents must complete a leave of absence form in advance. These are available from the school office.

## **Ollerton Library Summer Reading Challenge:**

This year Ollerton Library are taking part in the Summer Reading Challenge which runs from Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> July to Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> September. This year's theme is Wild World Heroes and is in partnership with the World Wildlife Fund (WWF.) The theme revolves around your local environment and how to make where you live a better place by making small changes. This is the national scheme run in libraries which challenges children 4+ to read 6 books over their summer holidays. They are rewarded with stickers and other incentives and finally a medal and a certificate. The scheme has proved to be useful in encouraging children to keep the reading habit over the summer break and prevent a dip in reading attainment. This year new for Notts we have a Minichallenge for 3s and under to also take a part in. Ollerton Library will also be doing wildlife themed crafts and activities in the summer holidays, the activities will either be a session within the library or take home packs.
