## **Our Latest Results**

On entry to our Nursery (beginning of EYFS) analysis shows that most pupils were working below age related expectations in all areas of learning.
At the end of our EYFS (Reception Class) 70% of children attained a good level of development compared with 69% nationally in 2016 having made good progress.
At the end of year 1 86% of pupils reached expected standard in Phonics compared with 81% nationally in 2016.
<b>By the end of Year 2</b> 97% of pupils reached expected standard in Phonics exceeding National averages.
At the end of Year 2 (KS1) 73% (Reading), 66% (Writing), 70% (Maths) and 66% (EPGS) were working at or above expected standard. (these were broadly in line with Nottinghamshire averages).

## KS2

The results below relate to our latest set of results from the children (Year 6 in their final year of Primary School) sitting KS2 exams in May 2017.

Progress measures are calculated for the progress made by children from assessments made at the end of year 2 to assessments made at the end of Year 6.

**Positive progress** means pupils on average **do better** at KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.

- Average progress in Reading = -1.2 representing progress placing the school in the top 75% of schools nationally for progress in Reading.
- Average progress in Writing = 1.1 representing positive overall progress placing the school in the top 40% of schools nationally for progress in Writing.
- <u>Average progress in mathematics</u> = -3.5 representing progress placing the school in the top 95% of schools nationally for progress in Maths.
- Percentage of pupils achieving the expected standard in reading,
  writing and mathematics combined was 34% compared to a National average of 61%
- Percentage of pupils achieving a high level of attainment in reading, writing and Mathematics combined was 3%.

The expected standard in the tests is a scaled score of 100 or above.

- Average scaled score at St Joseph's in reading was 101
- Average Scaled score at St Joseph's in grammar, punctuation and spelling was 102
- Average scaled score at St Joseph's in mathematics was 99
