Covid Updates

From February 24th the Government have asked that we now treat Covid like other infectious diseases and new guidance on this can be found at; <u>https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-response-living-with-covid-</u>

Until 1 April 2022, the government still advises people who test positive to stay at home, symptomatic testing remains free through PCR testing. Adults and children who test positive should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least five full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received two negative test results on consecutive days. Thereafter they can return to work and normal everyday life. **Positive Cases in School:**

Unfortunately, cases have increased slightly in school over the last two weeks, where we have seen 20 cases of covid across the school including both pupils and staff.

However, we are monitoring for signs of symptoms and ask that you also do this yourselves, along with following the guidance below. If you have any questions or concerns about Covid in school, please contact the school office and we will be happy to support you.

Thank you from our Governors

This week we held our Local Governors Board meeting. The Governors would like to pass on their thanks to the St Joseph's Community for supporting the school in making sure that the children have a readiness to learn, including wearing the correct uniform.

Ties

A school ties is part of the school uniform policy and all children are to wear their tie on a daily basis. Please can you ensure your child has a school tie. Ties are available to purchase through ParentMail. Any child who arrives at school will be required to borrow a school tie from the school office.

Uniform Changes and Prices

From 1st April there will be a change to the prices for the uniform purchased through school. We are currently speaking to the suppliers regarding this and as soon as prices are confirmed we will let you know what these will be.

We will also be changing the ties we will be selling. The clip on ties will no longer be available. What stock we have in school will be all that is left available. From September 2022 children in Foundation 1, Year 1 or Year 2 will have the option to wear an elasticated tie or a formal tie with Year 3 – 6 needing to wear a formal tie (different lengths will be available.)

Safety and Wellbeing in the Playground before and after school – Play Equipment

Following on from last weeks requests for parents to remain with their children in the school playground until all children have been directed to their classrooms, can we please now remind parents and children about the use of play equipment before and after school. We have unfortunately had a couple of incidents recently where balls have unfortunately hit adults and pushchairs at the end of the school day. Please can you ask your children not to use any of the school equipment, including the trim trail and footballs. All school equipment must be used under the supervision of staff members, for health and safety purposes.
