Act of Consecration of Russia and Ukraine, Message from Bishop Patrick:

In light of the current crisis in unfolding in Ukraine, Pope Francis will lead an Act of Consecration of Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on Friday 25th March, the solemnity of the Annunciation, at 5.00pm Rome time (4.00pm UK time).

The Bishops of England and Wales, in prayerful solidarity, will make the Act of Consecration in their Cathedrals at some suitable point that day.

Our children have this morning held an assembly to say a decade of the Rosary as requested by Bishop Patrick for the people of Ukraine.

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Covid Updates

From February 24th the Government have asked that we now treat Covid like other infectious diseases and new guidance on this can be found at; https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-response-living-with-covid-19

Until 1 April 2022, the government still advises people who test positive to stay at home, symptomatic testing remains free through PCR testing. Adults and children who test positive should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least five full days and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received two negative test results on consecutive days. Thereafter they can return to work and normal everyday life. **Positive Cases in School:**

Cases unfortunately, remain in school, however are slowly decreasing again. We currently have 7 pupils and staff absent with Covid.

We are monitoring for signs of symptoms and ask that you also do this yourselves, along with following the guidance below. If you have any questions or concerns about Covid in school, please contact the school office and we will be happy to support you.

Poppy Playtime / Huggy Wuggy

We have been made aware of Poppy Playtime which is a horror/puzzle game which involves the player investigating an abandoned toy factory to solve the mystery of what happened. The game involves a villainous teddy called Huggy Wuggy which may be frightening to some children and cause an increase in feelings of stress and anxiety.

Whilst the game does not appear to have any age restrictions, the developers have stated that this is unsuitable for young children.
