World Antimicrobial Awareness Week 18-24 November

What do we mean by 'Antimicrobials' and 'Antimicrobial resistance' or 'AMR'? Antimicrobials are medicines used to prevent and treat infections caused by microorganisms in humans, animals and plants.

Why is this important? Antimicrobial resistance remains one of the key problems within community and hospital settings within Europe. In many European countries, antibiotic prescription rates are highest in children. Improved hygiene in schools/communities reduces the transmission of infection (including COVID-19). It reduces illness in young people and their parents and resulting absenteeism. Antimicrobial resistance is a major threat to public health and it is essential to educate our future generation of antibiotic users and prescribers about this issue. Schools are able to use of the freely available and evidence-based UKHSA resources, e-Bug, Keep Antibiotics Working and Antibiotic Guardian, to educate young people.
