Covid-19

We would like to continue to reassure parents that we are continuing to follow the latest guidance to ensure that the St Joseph's community remain as safe as possible. We have had

several conversations this week with the DFE, Public Health England and the NHS Test and Trace service, to seek advice and guidance on measures we have in place and to discuss the necessity of the implementation of further safety procedures. We have been reassured that we are doing

everything within the guidelines, however, we have opted to revert back to some additional procedures we had in place during the Summer Term, including, reducing some cross class interaction activities. You will have noticed that some staff have reverted to wearing masks in and around school, we would encourage everyone to take the precautions they feel necessary to keep themselves and their families safe. As we respect their decisions, and any decisions your make, can we please ask that you respect staff- Keep distances where possible, and leave the school grounds as soon as your child is in school and as soon as you have collected them. Can we ask that there are no group gatherings and lengthy discussions taking part on the school grounds?

Looking after the School Grounds and Local Community

Can we please ask that you help us to keep the school grounds and surrounding community clean and tidy, and encourage all of our children to be responsible for their own actions in maintaining a clean and safe environment? There are several bins on the school grounds and public bins around the community, can we encourage our children to dispose of their rubbish appropriately and when no bins are available, keep hold of their rubbish until they arrive at school or return home. Maybe we could encourage some of our children to undertake litter picks on their way to and from school (safely). Not only does this make the area look nicer but protects wildlife from becoming trapped or eating indigestible materials.

Parking

We have been made aware that Newark and District Council and Nottinghamshire County Council are patrolling the local area, monitoring driving and parking situations on the roads surrounding the school. Please can we ask that you park safely outside of school, not blocking pavements, crossings or local residents' drives? Please also be aware that there are several areas around the school where it is illegal to park i.e. double yellow lines, zig zags and hashing's outside of school and resident only parking areas. Both NDC and NCC's enforcement teams will be issuing warnings and/or penalty notices to those that are breaking the law or creating a hazard to other road users.

Contacting staff outside of school hours

It has come to our attention that some parents are contacting staff outside of school hours through various forms of communication, including staff's private Social Media accounts to discuss school matters. We appreciate that some staff are connected to the parents and carers of St Joseph's pupils,

through friendship and family connections, however, we must insist that if you have any questions relating to school matters that you contact staff during their working hours. You can text, email or call the school office, the normal office hours are 8am – 4pm, however, there are often staff on site from 7.30am – 5.30pm, so please do try to contact us between these hours. If no one is available, please leave a message and the appropriate staff member will get back to you as soon as possible. All of our staff work very hard and deserve a well-earned break and some personal time outside of working hours, there are also safeguarding and GDPR regulations that we must follow.

Uniform, Hairstyles and Jewellery

Our children are looking wonderful in their new uniforms, and the new tank top style jumpers make our children look super smart. Please help us to remind children that shirts should be tucked in and ties worn at all times of the school day, unless advised otherwise by a staff member. Can we also please remind parents that only one non-decorative stud earring in each ear and a basic watch (no smart watches) are allowed to be worn in school. Hoop earrings, chains, bracelets etc could cause injury. No jewellery should be worn during P.E. lessons, please remove any earrings etc before sending your child to school on PE days. We also do not permit children to have extreme' haircuts, this would include hair with lines, images or words shaved into it along with Mohican style effects. Children with shoulder length hair or longer, may we please ask that this is tied back, this is to reduce the spread of head lice in school, and also to ensure the safety of children during PE, Games and Swimming or Science lessons.
