Covid

We're receiving messages of concern from parents seeking further advice with regards to the current guidelines relating to the local situation surrounding Covid-19. We would like to reassure all parents that we are doing our best to ensure that the St Joseph's community remains as safe as

In terms of test and trace and informing parents with regards to the situation in school, we are following guidelines given and communicating with the DFE and Test and Trace as and when necessary. Unfortunately, we are in a difficult situation this time, as we are no longer able to carry out test and trace ourselves. The requirement now, is that the person who has tested positive for Covid (or their responsible adult) must inform test and trace themselves and provide full contact details of who they have been in contact with, including school. Test and Trace will then contact us, if we need to take action or inform parents. As we have had no contact from Test and Trace we have sought further advice and what they have stated is that schools are exempt from Test and Trace due the guidelines stating that anyone under the age of 18years and 6months, do not need to isolate, even if they live within a household with a positive case. If you have any concerns please speak to a member of staff so we can discuss further any individual issues and concerns.

House Teams

All children have been allocated a house team. As our houses celebrate the UK Saints, we will be holding celebration days throughout the year for these. On the day of the patron saint, children within the house, are welcome to come into school wearing accessories or something in their Saints colour alongside their uniform – St Andrew, Blue – St David, Yellow - St Patrick, Green – St George, Red (see class teacher if you are unsure of what team your child is in).
