## **Head Teachers Message:**

A very warm welcome to all our new starters in both F1 and F2 - how smart you all looked this week walking onto the playground in your uniform for the first time. All the staff are very impressed with how smart all the children look this week. A polite reminder to label all uniform to ensure it is returned to you at the end of the day. We are slowly returning to pre-Covid normality and today we had our first whole school assembly where were able to sing again together, which was wonderful. What an exciting year we have planned!

#### **Start and Finish Times:**

As a reminder of our usual start and finish times children should arrive and be collected at the following times.



- Foundation 1 AM 8.30am 11.30am
- Foundation 1 PM 12.25pm 3.25pm
- Foundation 1 All Day 8.30am 3.25pm
- Foundation 2 Year 6 8.50am 3.30pm

The main school gates will open at 8.30am, children are expected to line up in the playground and wait to be escorted to the classrooms by one of the classroom staff. Children are no longer able to enter the classrooms as soon as they arrive as the classroom staff will be outside so there will be no supervision. The only time that there may be an exception to this, is if we are experiencing severe weather conditions. Staff will be in the school yard from the gates opening, to meet and greet the children, as well as supervise behaviour on the playground.

## Attendance:

As schools are returning to normal, following the last 18 months of disruption, we are now required to revert back to strict attendance monitoring and reporting. We have strict guidelines from the Local Authority and Department for Education to adhere to with regards to reporting and ensuring that children are in attendance on a regular basis. It is the expectation that children attend school and arrive on time on a daily basis. We appreciate and understand that this is not always possible as we all suffer from illness and with Covid-19 still having an impact on our lives, so with this in



suffer from illness and with Covid-19 still having an impact on our lives, so with this in mind, we would like to set a target for pupils to achieve a minimum of 96%.



Late marks will also be monitored – all class registers close within 10 minutes of the start of the school day, meaning all registers will be closed by 9am. Anyone arriving after 9 will be reported as late, and anyone arriving after 9.30am will be reported as an unauthorised late, there are some exemptions to this rule, i.e. medical appointments but evidence will be required and authorisation a mark for a late child is at the Head's discretion.

A high level of absence and late marks may result in Penalty Notices being issued by the local authority.

#### Covid-19

With the changes to the guidelines regarding Covid-19, we would just like to assure parents that we are continuing to following the latest guidance supplied by the Department of Education to ensure that the community remain safe. Where questions arise regarding Covid in School, we will seek advice where necessary. The new isolation rules state that people do not need to self-isolate if they are fully vaccinated or under the age of 18 years, 6 months unless they are contacted by the NHS Test and Trace service. 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## **School Policies, Concerns and Support**

Behaviour: We have high expectations in relation to the behaviour of the whole of the St Joseph's Community and where actions breach the school's policies, sanctions will be made. Actions which include but are not exclusive to-violence, intimidation, racism, use of inappropriate language are NOT acceptable and will NOT be tolerated. Any person who we believe to be behaving inappropriately will be spoken to, sanctions applied and where necessary parents informed.


we are no longer able to accept cash in the school office, except for charity purposes, all payments need to me made through ParentMail.

- Full Wrap Around Care Breakfast Club 7.30am 8.50am & After School Club 3.30pm 5.45pm - £7.00 per day
