What to do at the beginning of the session

- Your child will need to hang their coat on a peg in the cloak room. Please encourage your child to put their belongings on their peg. Their coat must be clearly **named** so that we can ensure the children have their own coat.
- The children find their name card and then go to our carpet and sit down quietly for register time or go to play.

Tapestry.

Tapestry is our electronic way of recording your child's learning journeys. It is a two way form of communication where you can upload photos and we can share their learning from school. You will have received an additional information letter which explains how to access the programme. We also use Marvellous me to keep in touch with you and Arbour, these are information sharing platforms.
