Resolution

The problem is resolved.

Ending

The main character continues safely on their journey.

The purpose of the text is for the main character to appear brave.

Grammar Focus 1: To use two adjectives before the noun.

An adjective is a describing word and a noun is an object, person or place.

Jack climbed up the enormous, towering beanstalk.

Grammar Focus 2: To use coordinating conjunctions.

A coordinating conjunction is used to join two clauses.

Jack ran away from the giant and climbed down the beanstalk.

coordinating conjunction

Grammar Focus 3: To use apostrophes for possession.

An apostrophe for possession is used to show what belongs to someone.

Jack's magic beans grew into a beanstalk.

possessive apostrophe
