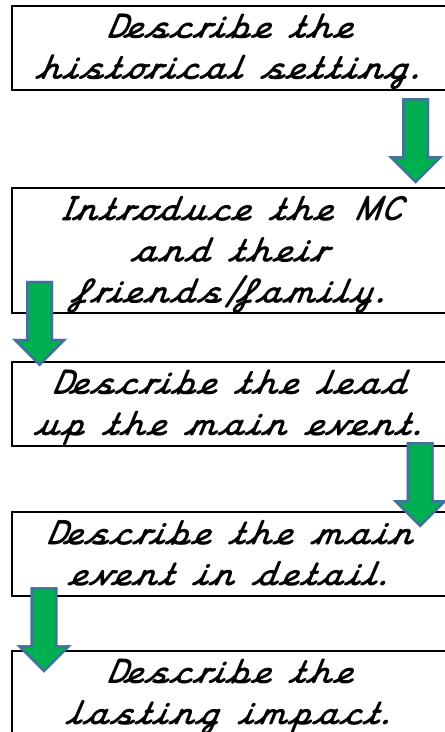

Grammar Focus 1: Adverbials of duration.

Used to describe how long something lasts for. These can come anywhere in a sentence, including as fronted adverbials.

Throughout the night, the aliens watched Jamie.

After he had watched Bambi, Jim cried for twelve hours.

Grammar Focus 2: Precise verbs.

A specific verb used to show particular meaning.

Holly sauntered through the Cheese Emporium factory.

Mary pecked at her sandwich while Josh devoured the entire buffet.
