Build Up

*Main characters learn of mysterious group.
Characters off to find the missing treasure.*



Problem

Main characters crack the code and set off to location. Characters discover mysterious group and get captured.



Resolution

Mysterious group steal treasures. Main characters escape and go for help.



Ending

*Mysterious group captured.
Treasure goes to the museum. Characters set off on another adventure.*

Grammar Focus 1: Direct Speech

Speech indicates when someone is speaking. Direct speech is indicated by inverted commas (speech marks).

"Er, aren't we meant to recite special rituals?" Ryan muttered nervously to nobody in particular. "To protect us from all the curses that guard the stone?"

Grammar Focus 2: Adverbial Clauses

An adverbial clause adds additional information to a sentence. An adverbial clause **always** starts with a subordinating conjunction (e.g. because, although, if, while, as, once).

Because of the burning sun, Ryan was sweating.

As soon as the van had stopped, Ryan and Cleo jumped out and began searching for the burial chamber.

The monster screamed because he was frightened.
