### Subject specific vocabulary

*coal mine* - where coal is extracted from the ground.

*colliery* - the coal mine and the building and equipment associated with it.

*community* - a group of people living in the same area.

*industry* - an organisation that sells something or helps us do something

*settlement* - a place where people live and work.



### Key Information

A settlement - a place where people live and work, will have some physical features can be made from natural and man-made materials.

Natural materials are dug out of the ground or taken from a living thing. For example, slate stone, wood and straw. Man-made materials are made by people, such as concrete, glass, plastic and paper.

A community is made up of the people, who live there. There are many people who work in and look after a community, for example, firefighters, police officers, teachers and librarians. It is also important to look after the environment in a community. This could mean picking up litter and planting new trees.

Communities can change over time. In the past, there would be lots of smaller shops, like a grocer's, bakery, sweet shop and butchers. Today, we might get most of our things from a supermarket.
