


# Fables, Myths and Legends

## Key Vocabulary

Moral	A moral is a lesson from a story or experience
Fable	A fable is a short story with animals as characters.
Exclamation mark	Ends a sentence to show a strong feeling!
Co ordinating conjunction	Used to join two clauses together. Examples are and, but or.
verb	A verb is an action word to describe what the noun is doing.
Noun	A noun is a person, place or thing
Adverb	An adverb gives more detail to the verb



## Key Information

- 1 A fable is a short story, usually with animals as characters, with a moral to the story.
- 2 A moral is a lesson from a story or experience that makes you think and often highlights right and wrong behaviour.
- 3 Co ordinating conjunction joins clauses together eg. and, but or
- 4 Exclamation marks come at the end of a sentence to show a strong feeling.
- 5 Sentences are made up of nouns, verbs and adverbs

## Worked Examples

### Co-ordinating Conjunctions

And - Used to add or connect similar ideas or elements.

I like coffee and she prefers tea.

But - Used to introduce a contrast or exception.

I wanted to go to the party but I had to work.

Or - Used to present alternatives or choices.

Do you want pizza or pasta for dinner?

Verb - an action word

The dog walked with his owner.

Noun - Person, place or thing

The mouse scurried away.

Adverb - gives more detail to the verb

The boy jumped quickly over the gate.

Exclamation mark ends a sentence strongly.

The lion roared!
