Topic Launch

For our topic launch, we will visit Creswell Crags on Friday 8th November. At Creswell Crags, we will enter one of the caves and consider how the Stone Age people survived. We will build shelters suitable for the hunter gatherers and look at how they communicated by recreating some cave art. This trip is bookable via Arbor.

Homework

Spelling Test

Spelling lessons are completed as part of our weekly literacy activities and therefore the spelling practise sheet will be issued after Monday's lesson. Spellings should be practised at home in preparation for a test on a Friday.

PE kits

It is our final Forest School session on Friday 18th October. After half term, children should have their PE kit in school Monday to Friday however, PE will likely be on a Tuesday. This should consist of a white pe top with dark shorts/jogging bottoms. We will be doing PE outdoors so please send children with a jumper/hoodie.
