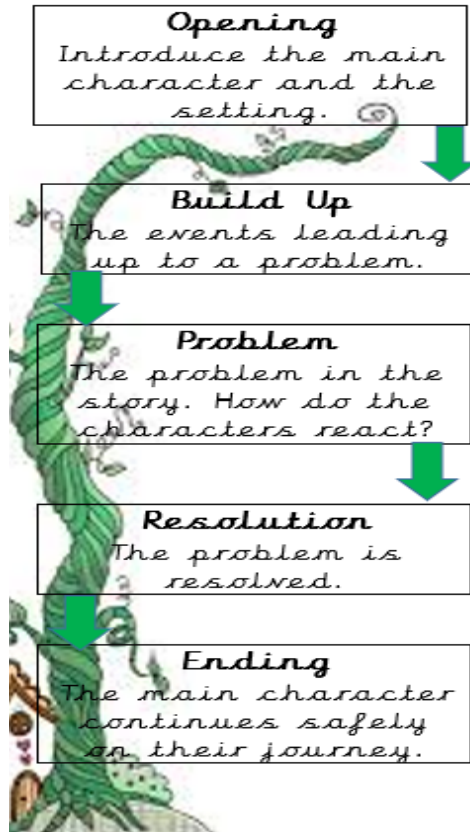


Traditional Tales - Jack and the Beanstalk
