Prior Knowledge

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COLOUR	Know that the primary colours are red, yellow and blue. Know that primary colours can be mixed to make secondary colours: • Red + yellow = orange • Yellow + blue = green • Blue + red = purple
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Know that drawing and painting tools can be used in a variety of ways to create different lines.

Know that lines can represent movement in drawings.



Key Information

- 1 LS Lowry (Laurence Stephen Lowry) was born 1st November 1887 in Stretford, Lancashire and he was an artist.
- 2 The landscape where he lived, had many factories and he used these images for his paintings. His paintings captured scenes from industrial England
 - from industrial England Lowry's paintings were populated by 'matchstick men' figures.

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- Know that different amounts of paint and water can be used to mix secondary colours
- By mixing primary colours together it is possible to make secondary colours
- Black can make a colour darker, whilst white will make a colour lighter. You can make many tones from the original colour
