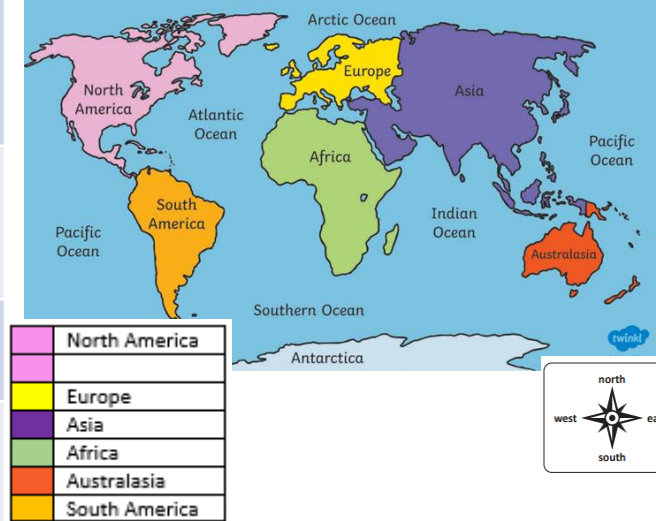


Sail the Seven Seas (Oceans)! Knowledge Organiser

Key Vocabulary

human feature	Are the things you see around you that were created and put there by people.
physical feature	Are the things that you see around you that are there naturally.
aerial map	A picture taken of the world from above
key	Is information on a map explaining what colours/symbols represents.
continent	A large area of land made up of multiple countries.
country	A home to a specific group of people controlled by a government.
sea	A body of water usually meeting the coastline.
ocean	A continuous body of water that separates the continents.

Continents and Oceans



Key Information

- 1 A continent is made up of numerous countries
- 2 There are 7 continents: North America, South America, Africa, Europe, Asia, Australasia, Antarctica
- 3 A sea is water that usually meets a coastline
An ocean is water separating the continents
- 4 There are 5 Oceans: Pacific Ocean, Atlantic Ocean, Arctic Ocean, Indian Ocean and Southern Ocean
- 5 A human feature has been created by people eg. Building, town, city
- 6 A physical feature are things that are naturally formed eg. Mountain, river

(year 1 history) • Know how to identify physical features on an aerial map e.g. mountains, rivers • Know how physical features are represented in a key. • Know how to use a key to locate physical features on a map.
